

Year C - First Sunday of Lent

Luke 4:1-13

What would you choose? 'Yes' or 'No'?



Jesus was strong and was able to say 'yes' to God's ways and 'no' to things that were not of God. We can be strong too but sometimes we need to practice.

This activity offers a selection of scenario's or choices that the children can use their signs to choose to say 'yes' or 'no' to and practice making choices that follow God's ways.

Read each scenario in turn and invite the children to hold up their sign to either 'yes' or 'no', then discuss their answers.



Would you take your brother's piece of cake without asking?



Would you share your toys with your neighbour?



Would you throw your rubbish on the ground?



Would you do the dishes without being asked?



Would you call someone a mean name?



Would you help someone who was hurt on the playground?



Would you tell the truth and own up to breaking something at home?



Would you ignore your parents when they tell you 'it's time for bed'?



Would you give some money to the poor?



Would you say a prayer for someone who is sick?



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Saying 'yes' and 'no'

You will need:

- Copies of the 'yes' and 'no' template on the following page
- Colouring pens/pencils
- Craft sticks
- Sticky tape or glue

Instructions:

- Give each child one of the templates to colour or decorate as they choose.
- Fold the template in half, so that the words are shown on the outside of the sign.
- Attach the craft stick to the inside of the sign and then secure either side of the sign so that the children can turn it from side to side to display either 'yes' or 'no'.
