WEEK 1

Can We Trust the Scriptures?

Is the bible, and specifically the New Testament, a reliable source? Should we trust it? How does it compare with other historical sources from the same era?

WEEK 2

Ecclesial Exegesis: Interpreting Scripture with the Church

Scripture can be interpreted in many ways, and when interpreted in isolation from the Church, it can lead to division. How do we interpret scripture within the tradition of the Church?

WEEK 3

The Unity of the Two Testaments

Marcion is infamous for rejecting the Old Testament as though it portrayed an entirely different God than in the New Testament. What is it that unites these two Testaments and how can they be understood as an ongoing and deepening revelation of God?

WEEK 4

The 'Grand Narrative' – Stories Within a Larger Story

The bible is loaded with stories – but what's the overarching story in scripture, how do the many stories in the bible sit within this larger story, and how does narrative serve to reveal God?

WEEK 5

The Gospels: Matthew, Mark and John

What are the Gospels? Why do they take mainstage in our liturgies? What are the differences between Matthew, Mark's and John's approach?

WEEK 6

Luke and the Acts of the Apostles

Luke wrote both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. What does Luke-Acts teach us about Jesus and the early Church?

WEEK 7

The Letters

There are various letters to various communities in the New Testament. How do we understand these letters in context, taking into account their authors and the communities they're addressing?

WEEK 8

Biblical Foundations for Catholic Doctrines

At times the Catholic tradition is criticised as being un-biblical. What are the biblical foundations for Catholic teachings such as: the papacy, purgatory, the role of Mary and the sacrament of confession.

WEEK 9

Scripture in the Liturgy and the Role of the Lector

The Mass is both the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. What is the role of scripture in the Mass and how does it lead us to the Eucharist? What does it mean to proclaim the word of God in the Mass as a lector?

WEEK 10

The Sacramentality of Scripture

Scripture in the Catholic tradition is more than text on a page, it is sacramental. What does this mean and how can we engage this sacramental text in our prayer life at home?
