Good things came to you and bad things to Lazarus; now he is comforted while you are in agony.

Jesus told his disciples this story:

"There was once a rich man who wore expensive clothes and every day ate the best food. But a poor beggar named Lazarus was brought to the gate of the rich man's house. He was happy just to eat the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. "His body was covered with sores, and dogs kept coming up to lick them. The poor man died, and angels took him to the place of honour next to Abraham. "The rich man also died and was buried. He went to hell and was suffering terribly. When he looked up and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side, he said to Abraham, 'Have pity on me! Send Lazarus to dip his finger in water and touch my tongue. I'm suffering terribly in this fire.'

#### Abraham answered,

'My friend, remember that while you lived, you had everything good, and Lazarus had everything bad. Now he is happy, and you are in pain. And besides, there is a deep ditch between us, and no one from either side can cross over.' "But the rich man said, Abraham, then please send Lazarus to my father's home. Let him warn my five brothers, so they won't come to this horrible place.' "Abraham answered, 'Your brothers can read what Moses and the prophets wrote. They should pay attention to that.' "Then the rich man said, 'No, that's not enough! If only someone from the dead would go to them, they would listen and turn to God.' "So Abraham said, 'If they won't pay attention to Moses and the prophets, they won't listen even to someone who comes back from the dead.'

#### **Introduction:** Begin with a short story:

There was a pond at the bottom of a large garden. A dragonfly laid its eggs in this pond and flew away. The eggs hatched and became larvae and they had a happy life swimming around the pond under the surface. But then, they noticed that something strange would happen to the older larvae who hatched before them. The would begin to swim upwards getting closer to the surface until finally they broke through, and they would never see them again. The younger larvae were all trying to work out what happened on the other side and couldn't figure it out. So the younger larvae made a deal with each another, if one of them made it to the other side they would come back and tell the others what it was like. One day one of the younger larvae felt something strange inside, he had a sudden urge to swim upwards, he just couldn't stop himself! 'This is it,' he thought 'I'm going to the other side!' Finally, he reached the top of the pond and broke through the other side! First all he could see was a bright white light, then when his eyes adjusted he could see the great garden.
