Advent is a journey



### Message

• Advent is a journey - Where we are going is exciting but there is a lot to learn on the way.

- Introduction Have you noticed how we have new colours out today, instead of green, there is purple and that's because we are starting a new season in the Church. In fact it's a new year for the church. Who knows what is this new season? Advent!
  - Who has ever been on a long journey before? Maybe you've been on an aeroplane, or a train or a really long road trip? Ask questions about their trips how long did it take, where did they go.
  - Before you leave for the trip, what are some things you need to do to get ready? Pack your bags, fuel for the car, snacks. There is stuff you need to do to get ready.
  - Advent is like that. It's a time to get ready, to go on a journey before we arrive at something special - Christmas.
  - That's what today's Gospel reading is about -It's telling us to be alert- get ready - something amazing is about to come.
  - For the people 2000 years ago, they didn't really know what to expect. They knew God had promised them, someone, who was going to save them, so they thought maybe it's a warrior or a great King, someone powerful. But we know who it is who God sends ... Jesus!



• This little baby, born in a stable amongst the barn animals, it's greater than all the warriors and kings that the people were expecting, and he will save us all!
