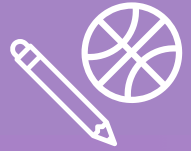


Year C - Fourth Sunday of Advent

Objective

To show how others may have different views and opinions than themselves and may have different ways they like to love others and receive that love.

Instructions

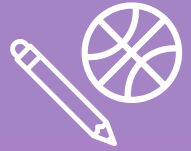
Read out a statement that begins with 'Would you rather ..' then offer two options. Get the children to stand on one side of the room or the other depending on their answer. Ask the children why the reasons behind their answer.

Sample Questions

Would you rather:

- have chocolate or lollies
- eat KFC or McDonalds
- play Rugby or Football
- spend the day outside or inside
- be around lot's of people or a small group of friends
- pray by having some quiet time on your own to think and speak to God or be with others and say our prayers together
- pray by writing a letter to God or by listening and singing along with music for God.
- make someone feel better by writing them a kind note or do one of their chores/job for them
- cheer someone up by spending time with them doing what they like or by giving them a hug
- someone help me with my homework or play a game with me when I've finished my homework
- someone say affirm me (say kind things to me) or give me a hug

The Angels Candle
