- Introduction John the Baptist was a prophet, he had a special job to tell people that the Messiah, Jesus was coming. When Jesus arrived he pointed people to Jesus and even baptised him!
 - A lot of us here would have been baptised when we were a baby. It's what happens when your parents say, I want to welcome our child into a family of faith - the Catholic Church.

Message

- When Jesus was baptised he went into the water at the River Jordan, and John the Baptist baptised him as a sign of a new life.
- When we were baptised, the priest poured water over our heads and baptised us in as a sign of new life as well. What we do at our baptism is very similar to what Jesus did at his.
- But as babies, we are too little to know what is happening and how important it is, so our parents and our godparents make some promises and professions on our behalf.
- They promise to care for you, to help grow your faith and protect you from sin.
- And they profess their faith, they say they believe in God.
- As we get older and we learn more about God and our faith it becomes our job to say those promises and professions for ourselves, to follow God and believe in him.
